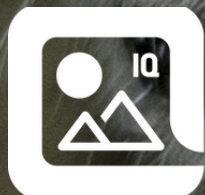

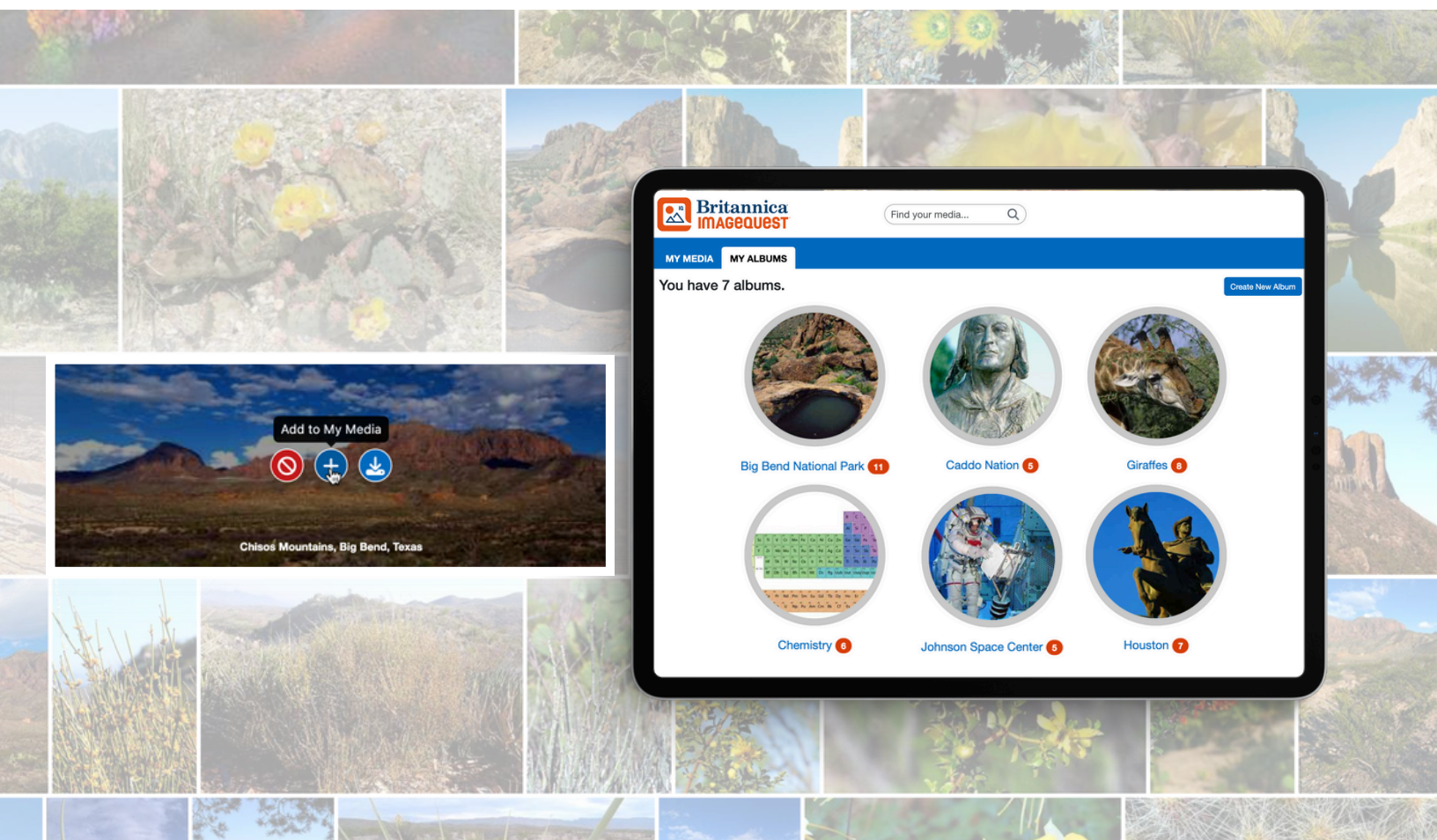

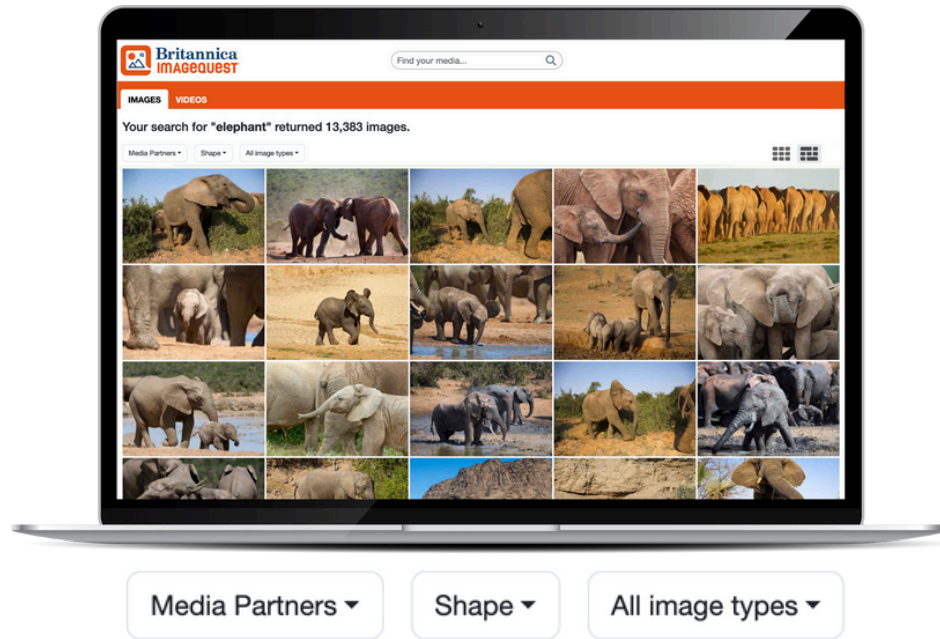


How can teachers use My Media?

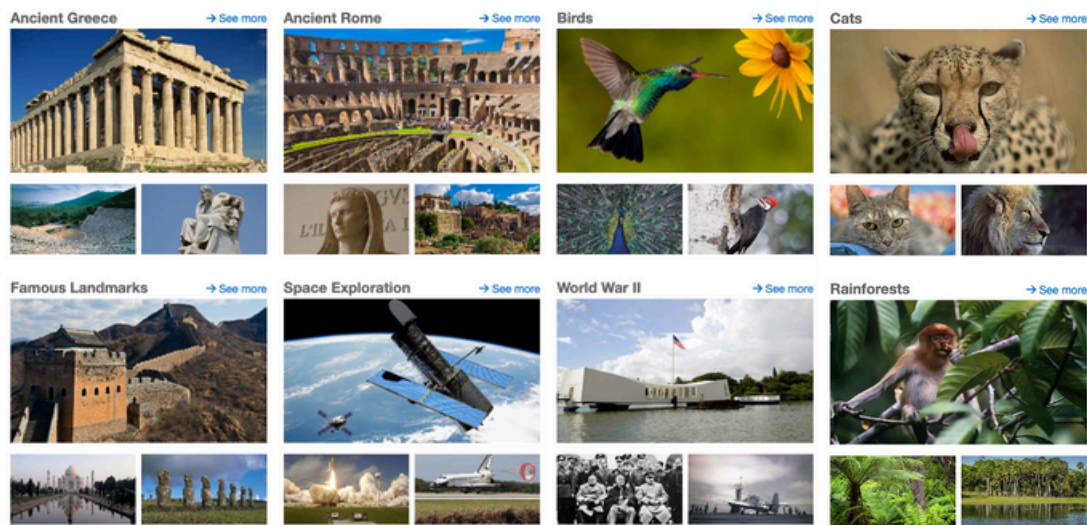
How can students use My Media?

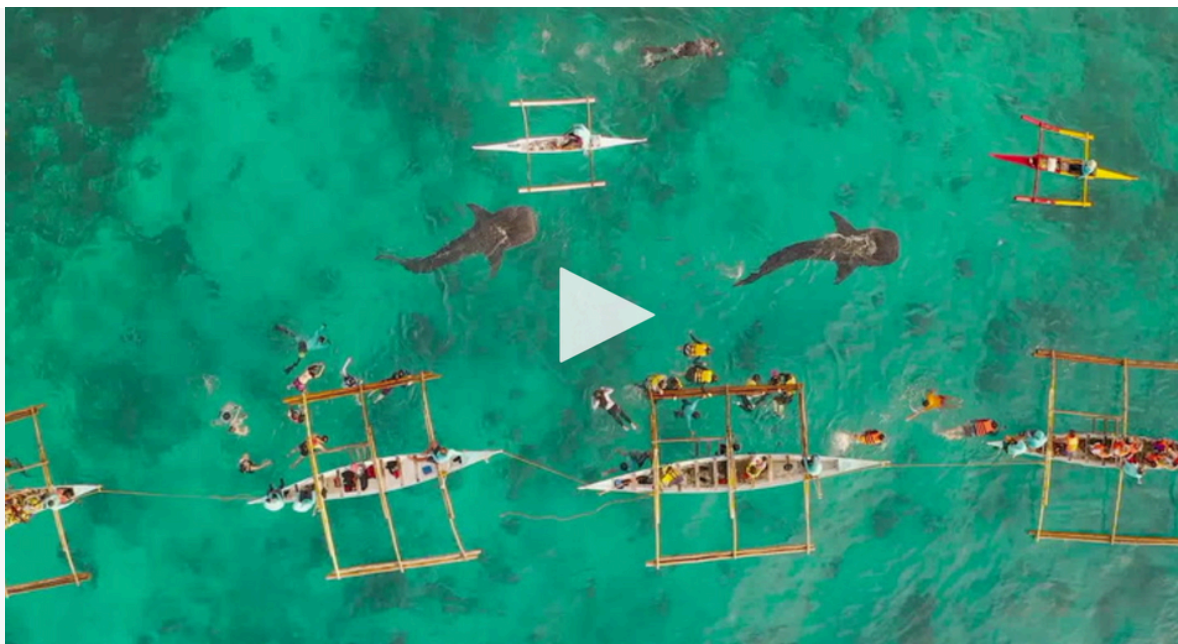

Image Story

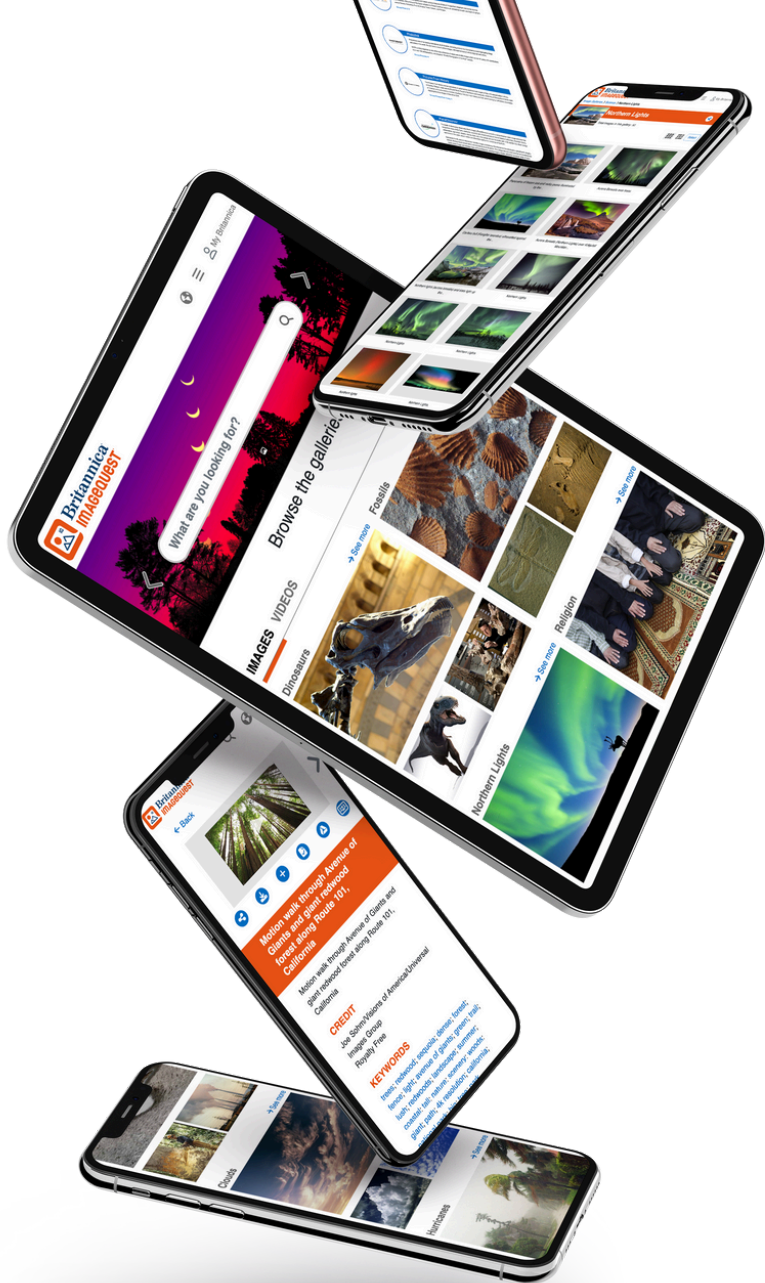
Combine the power of images and storytelling to enhance media literacy! Use Image Story to inform others about a research topic using the sequencing of images and text.
