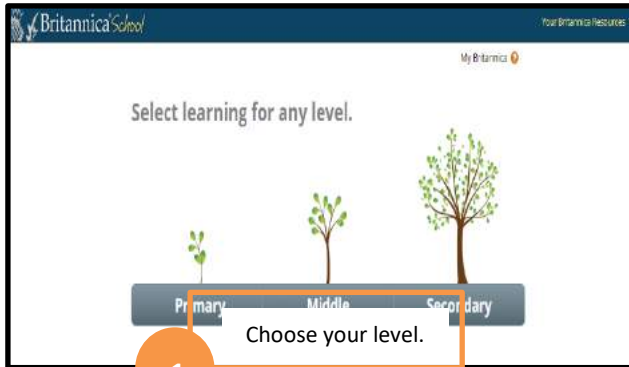

Add content to your research pack by clicking on the star in the search results OR content tool bar. Add to an existing resource pack or create a new one.

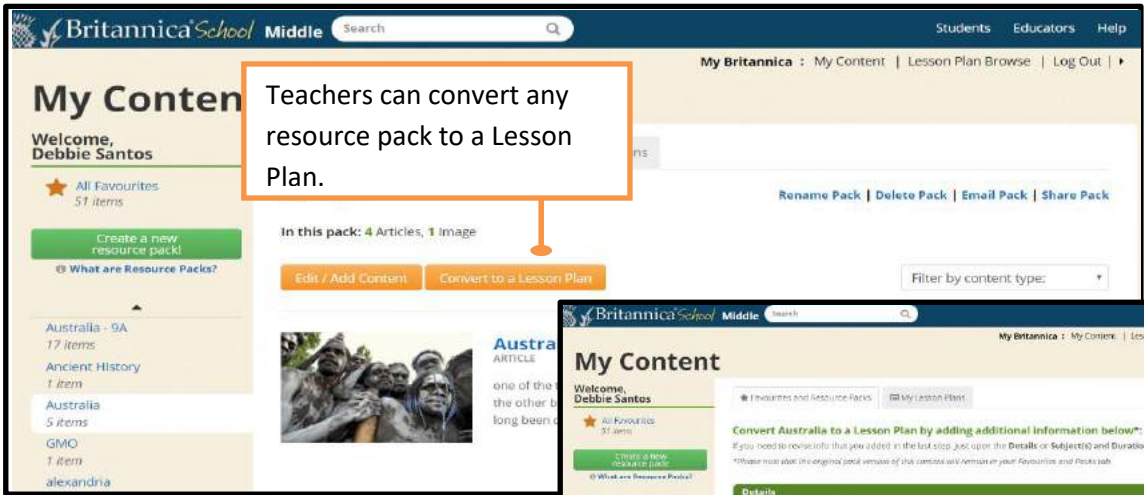

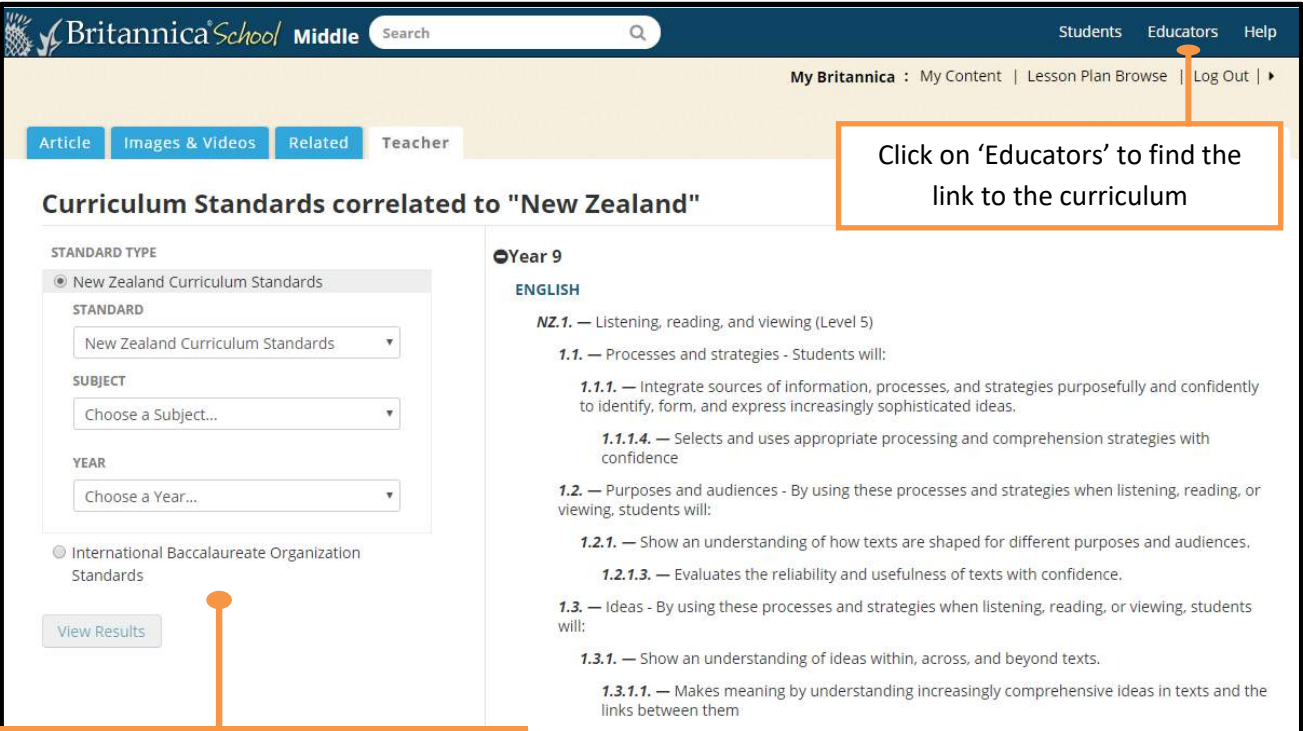
