
## At-A-Glance Articles

White light is a mixture of all the colors of the rainbow. A prism breaks up white light into its component colors by refracting, or bending, each color a different amount.



The Amazon might be the world's longest river. Most scientists believe it is at least 4,000 miles (6,400 km) long—still shorter than the Nile, which is about 4,132 miles (6,650 km). Others, however, have asserted that the Amazon is actually much longer. The Amazon's start and end points have been difficult to determine.

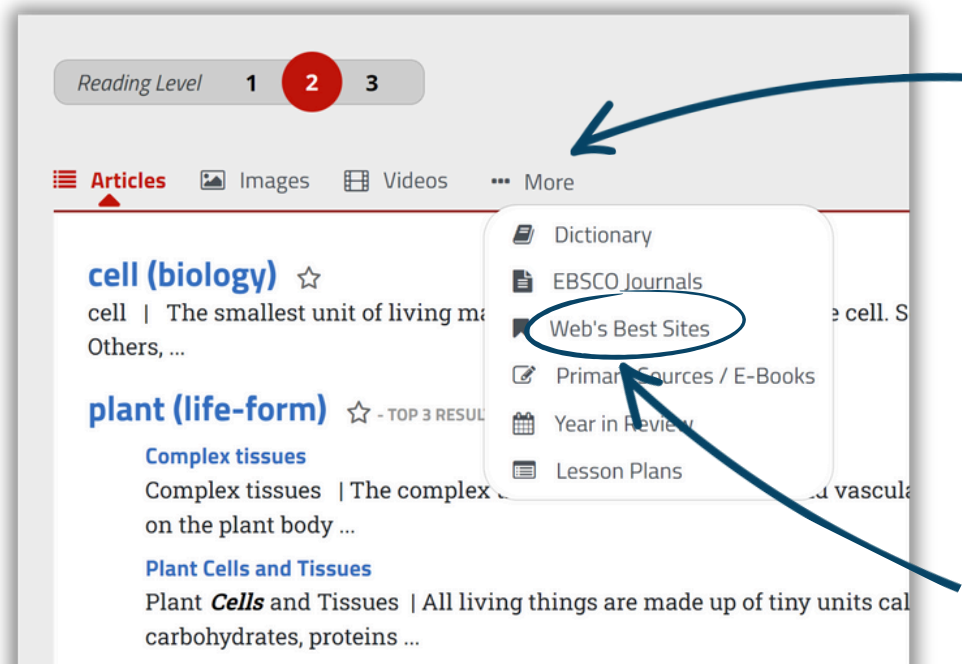
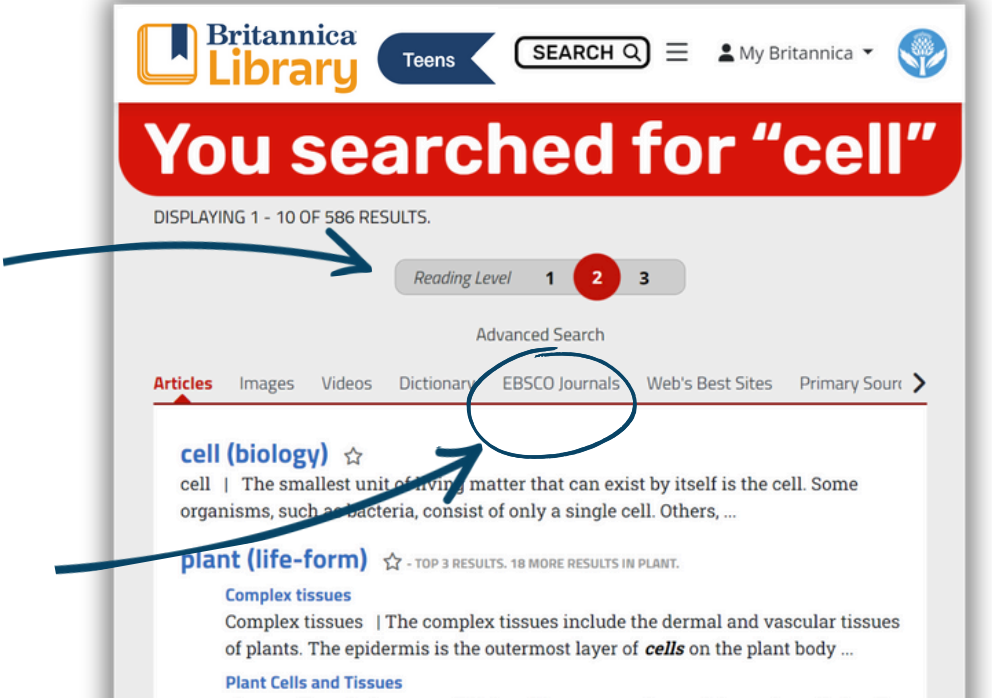

## Multimedia

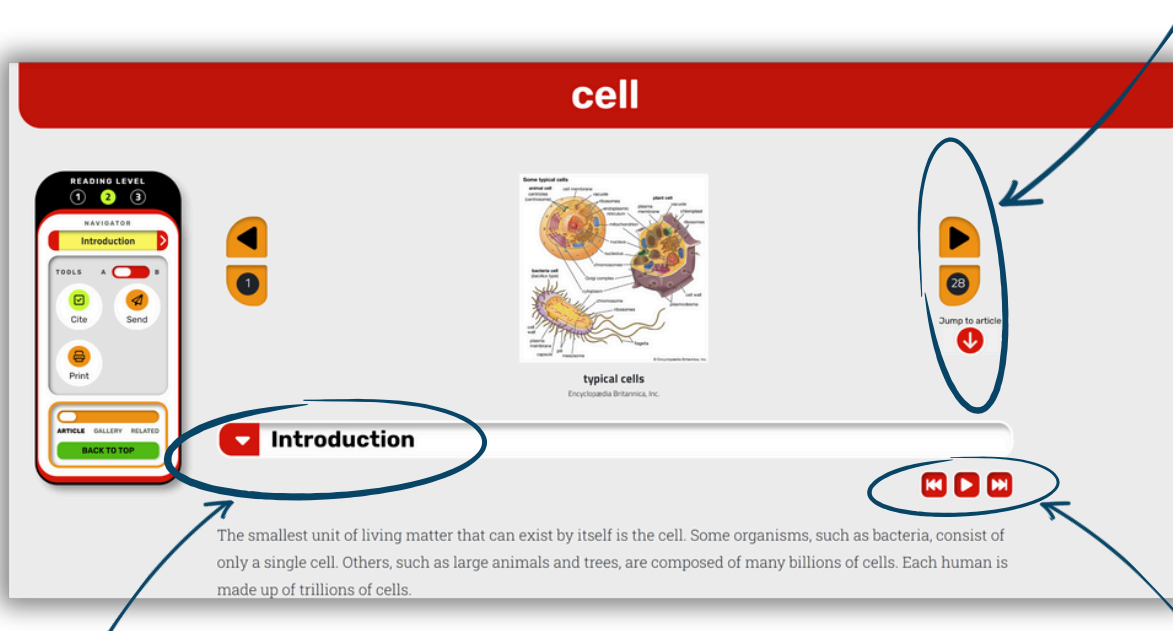
Learners have access to a large number of high-quality videos and images to enhance media literacy skills.

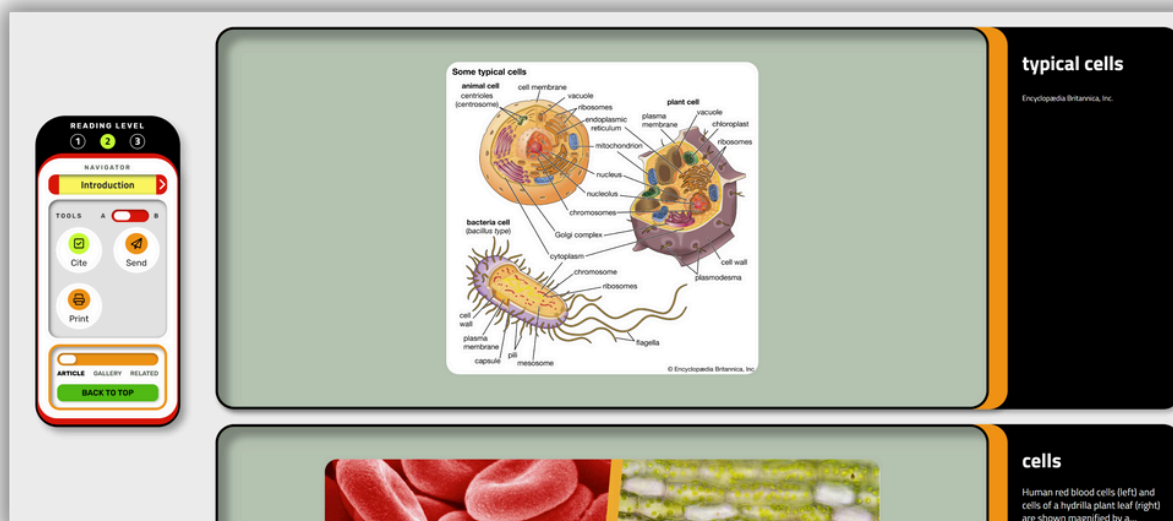
# Article Page

Browse media related to the article using the left/right arrows and the Jump to Article button in the **Article Media Gallery**.



Click the **article section headings** to collapse and expand content.

## Article

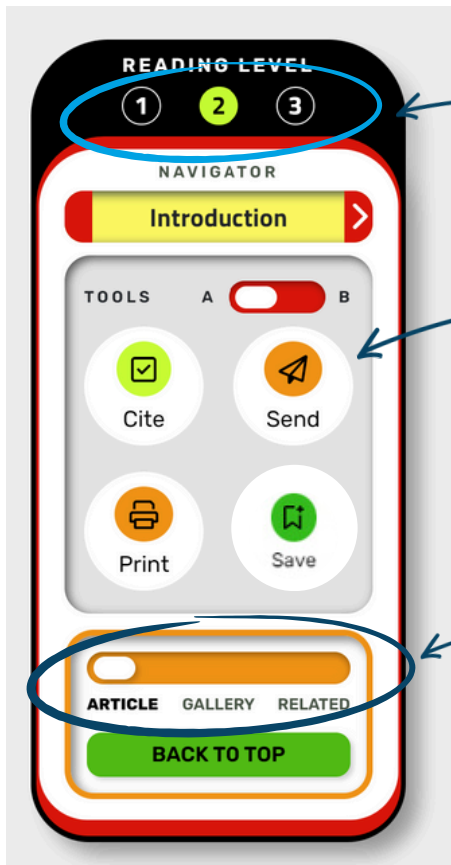
Sections of an article can be expanded or collapsed with one click, making it easy for learners to find and engage with information. Click the audio play button to hear the article section **read aloud**. Use the **article controller** (see next page) to adjust text size, translate to another language, or convert the article to OpenDyslexic font.

## Media

Related media for an article appears inline, as well as at the top of the page in the **Article Media Gallery**. Use the left / right arrows to browse all media. Click the **Jump to Article** button to go directly to the section of the article where a particular piece of media appears.

Your **Article Controller** lets you access all content page tools with just one click or toggle!



## Reading Level

Select from up to 3 different reading levels for each article.

## Cite, Send, Save & Print

Click “Cite” to generate an article citation in 4 standard formats. Click “Send” for the option to share the article via email, Google Drive or MS OneDrive. Click “Save” to save the article to your favourites folder in My Britannica.

## Article, Gallery or Related

Use the toggle to navigate to the article, media gallery or related resources.

## Tools Toggle

Toggle from A to B to see more content page tools.

## Font Size

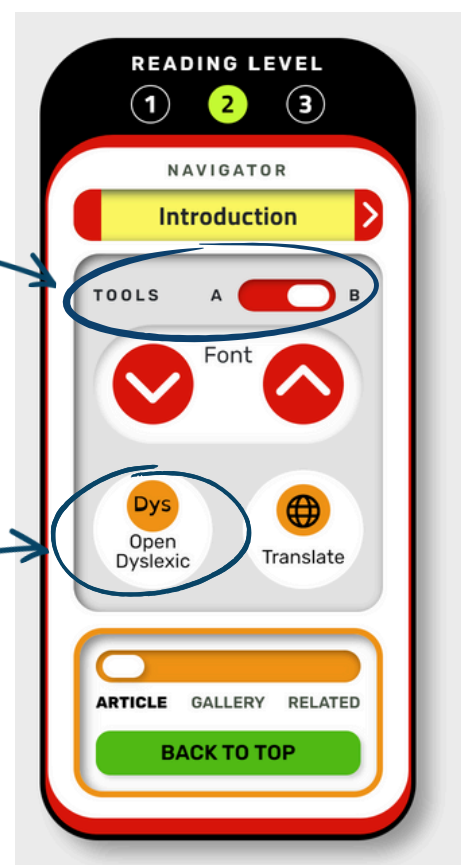
Use the up and down arrows to increase and decrease article font size.

Click to turn the OpenDyslexic font on or off.

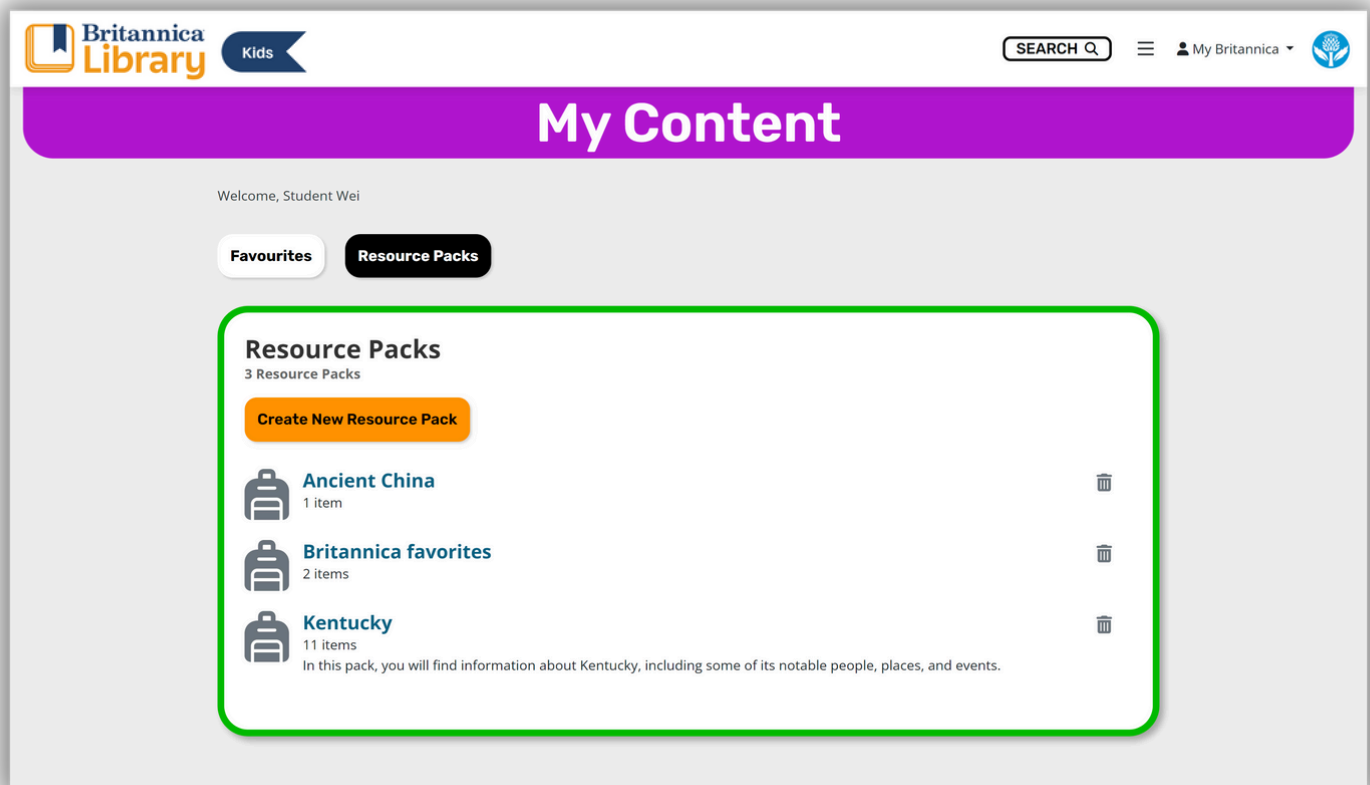
## Translate
